




CANTON, Ohlo, Sept. 18 .- Jim Thorpe, famous Indian football player and coach Evans of the Canton Bulldogs, a local professional team, has been chosen head of pach up the American Professional Football Association, the only professional football organization in the country, according to announcement here today.

MINUTES OF MEETING - SEPTEMBER 17th-1920.

Meeting called to order at 8:15 P.M., by Chairman, Mr. Hay. Teams represented were, Canton Bulldogs, Cloveland Indians, Dayton Triangles, Akron Professionals, Massillon Tigers, Rochester, N.Y., Rock Island, Ill., Muncie, Ind., Staley A.C. Decatur, Ill., Racine Cardinals, Wisconsin, and Hammond, Ind.

Minutes of previous meeting were given in a resume by the Chairman.

Massillon withdrew from professional football for the season of 1920.

New Business.

It was moved and seconded that a permanent organization be formed to be known as American Professional Football Association. Notion carried.

Moved and seconded that officers be now elected, consisting of President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. Carried.

Mr. Jim Thorpe was unanimously elected President, Mr. Stan Cofall, vice President, and Mr. A. F. Ranney, Secretary and Treasurer.

Moved and seconded that a fee of \$100.00 be charged for membership in the Association. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the president appoint a

AKRON PROFESSIONAL FOOTBALL TEAM CARROLL AND BEAVER STREETS comittee to work in conjunction with a lawyer to draft a Constitution, bylaws and rules for the Association. IF. Thorpo appointed IF. A. A. Young of Harmond. Chairman, and Mosors. Cofall, Plannigan and Storch associates. Hoved and seconded that all Clubs mail to the Secretary by January I, 1931, a list of all players used by them this season, the Secretary to furnish all Clubs with cuplicate copy of same, so that each club would have first choice in sorvices


Moved and meconded that all nombers have printed upon their stationery, Member of American Professional Pootball

#### Who was John Madden?

- Charasimatic coach for the Oakland Raiders 1969-1978
  - □Never had a losing season
  - □Inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2006 for his coaching career
- Commercial Celebrity
- Top Broadcaster in the NFL 1979-2009
- Co-Creator of Madden NFL Video Game 1988 Present
  - □Over \$4 billion in sales
- Most Famous Aerophobic (Fear of Flying) in the United States
  - ☐Stopped flying in 1979
  - ☐ Famously traveled via the "Madden Cruiser"



### History and Travels Madden Cruiser

- Madden began broadcasting in 1979 and late that season vowed to never fly again
- Greyhound offered the a Greyhound bus converted into an RV to Madden in 1987 in exchange for speaking engagements
- John Madden donated his first Madden Cruiser in 2018
- In 1994 after 600,000 miles on the road the original Madden Cruiser was retired

### History Madden Cruisers

- Madden would have five more Cruisers until the end of his broadcast career in 2009
- Sponsors included Walker Mufflers and Outback Steakhouse
- Madden's costs were food and telephone calls
- After receiving a new RV the original Madden Cruiser was initially used by family for travel
- Madden's agent Sandy Montag was given the bus for RV-ing.
   The exterior was changed.

### Madden Cruiser Challenges for the Hall

- There was no space inside the building to exhibit or store the Madden Cruiser
- No funding allocated to its care
- No vehicle care expert on staff
- No plan for the Madden Cruiser to generate revenue
- Exterior of the Madden Cruiser had changed


#### NFL ANNOUNCES THE PASSING OF JOHN MADDEN

Earlier today we received the sad news that the great John Madden died unexpectedly this morning. He was 85.

"On behalf of the entire NFL family, we extend our condolences to Virginia, Mike, Joe and their families," said NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell. "We all know him as the Hall of Fame coach of the Oakland Raiders and broadcaster who worked for every major network, but more than anything, he was a devoted husband, father and grandfather.

"Nobody loved football more than Coach. He was football. He was an incredible sounding board to me and so many others. There will never be another John Madden, and we will forever be indebted to him for all he did to make football and the NFL what it is today."



## Points to Consider When Collecting Large Historic Vehicles

- Space ☐ Do you have indoor or outdoor exhibit space? Do you have storage space? Educational piece or accessioned artifact? □ Operable? Staffing ☐ Do you have vehicle care experts? ☐ Do you have staff that can move or operate it? ☐ Do you have guest services staffing? Costs ☐ There will be yearly costs. Can you afford that? ☐ Can a benafactor fund the care? ☐ Do you have equipment for support?
- Don't collect it if you don't have the organization's commitment or resources for proper care.
